

# Language and Text...and Layering

## Supply List:

Acrylic paints: Black, White, Blue, Yellow, Red, Brown (**no smaller than 8 oz. jars or tubes**)

Think of a word, poem, quote, name or anything in any language that you want to incorporate into a painting

Writing utensils **of your choice** (pencil, charcoal, Sharpie, conte, pen, etc.)

Acrylic Gel Medium (you can choose from matte, gloss, semi-gloss, soft, regular or hard...any type will work **as long as it is called "acrylic gel medium"**)

Paint brushes – 3 or 4 in a variety of sizes and styles

2" or 3" wide foam paintbrush – 1

Plastic container for water (needs to be something big enough for your wide brushes to fit in) – 1 or 2

Any type of paint palette (can use something like a paper plate or recycled styrofoam food container)

3 sheets of 18x24" multimedia paper (**something sturdier than drawing paper and heavier than the multi media tablets...watercolor paper works well**)

Scrap paper or a sketchbook

Roll of paper towels

## Optional:

Trash or any paper with words printed on it, pages from old books, letter and/or number stencils, piece of medium grade sand paper, Modge Podge or Elmers Glue, scissors, painter's tape, sponge, medicine dropper, India ink, wrapping paper, receipts, bubble wrap, graph paper, music sheets (or photo copies of music sheets), coloring book pages, cotton balls
